A Godly Husband

Ephesians 5:25-33

I. Marriage - God Ordained Institution

Genesis 2:18 "And the LORD God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him."

Genesis 2:21-24 "And the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept: and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof; And the rib, which the LORD God had taken from man, made he a woman, and brought her unto the man. And Adam said, This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man. Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh."

II. Responsibilities Of A Godly Husband

A) Leave Father and Mother

Matthew 19:5 "And said, For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife..."

- Must be mature, responsible
- B) Cleave To His Wife

Matthew 19:5-6 "And said, For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they twain shall be one flesh? Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder."

- Cleave "glue, stick close, join"
- C) Husband Is Head Of Wife

Ephesians 5:23 *"For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church: and he is the saviour of the body."*

Head – "leader or ruling authority"

D) Husband Love Your Wives

Ephesians 5:25 "Husbands, love your wives..."

Ephesians 5:28 "So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies."

Ephesians 5:33 "...let every one of you in particular so love his wife even as himself..."

- Commanded by God
- On the command of love Contending For The Faith commentary states, "The keeping of this command is not contingent on a wife's being lovable or submissive but is contingent on the husband's willingness to submit to Christ"
- Although there should be strong feelings towards one's wife, love is a command and is something one does
- Example: Husband tells preachers, "I don't love my wife anymore." Preacher responded, "You better repent because you have committed a sin."
- 1) A Sacrificial Love

Ephesians 5:25 *"Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it;"*

- Is my wife a better person because of me?
- Is my wife a better Christian because of me?
- Am I hindering my wife?
- If you are not doing everything within your power to allow your wife to become the woman God wants her to be you must ask yourself, "Do I love my wife?"

2) A Self Considering Love

Ephesians 5:28-29 "So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies. He that loveth his wife loveth himself. For no man ever yet hated his own flesh; but nourisheth and cherisheth it, even as the Lord the church:"

Ephesians 5:33 "Nevertheless let every one of you in particular so love his wife even as himself; and the wife see that she reverence her husband."

- Nourisheth "*to nourish up to maturity*" *Thayer*
- Cherisheth "to cherish with tender love, to foster with tender care" Thayer
- Men take care of own body food, clothing, etc...
- Men make themselves happy golf, fishing, outdoors, etc...
- How do you know if you are practicing self-considering love?
 - ✓ Checkbook
 - ✓ Planner
 - ✓ Speech
 - ✓ Prayers

E) Honor Your Wife

I Peter 3:7 "Likewise, ye husbands, dwell with them according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life; that your prayers be not hindered."

- Knowledge "objective knowledge: what is known concerning divine things and human duties" Thayer
- J.N.D. Kelly in his commentary remarks, "understanding, Here it means Christian insight and tact, a conscious sensitivity to God's will."
- McKnight's commentary states, "From a like regard to the will of God, Christian husbands cohabit with your wives, performing your duties to them, according to the superior knowledge which your religion gives of these duties;..."
- F) Provide For His Wife

I Timothy 5:8 "But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel."

G) Render Due Benevolence

I Corinthians 7:1-4

H) Be Not Bitter

Colossians 3:19 "Husbands, love your wives, and be not bitter against them."

- Kittle's describes this word, "to make bitter, to embitter, to become bitter. It speaks of friction caused by impatience and thoughtless nagging."
- I) Live Joyfully With

Ecclesiastes 9:9 "Live joyfully with the wife whom thou lovest all the days of the life of thy vanity..."
